## 4. First-aid measures

<b>Inhalation</b>	If inhaled, move person to fresh air. If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth if possible. Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice.
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<b>Skin contact</b>	If on skin or clothing, take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15–20 minutes. Call a poison control centre or doctor for treatment advice.

## 5. Fire-fighting measures

<b>Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up</b>	Prevent entry into waterways, sewer, basements or confined areas.  Large Spills: Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Dike the spilled material, where this is possible. Absorb in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers. Following product recovery, flush area with water.  Small Spills: Wipe up with absorbent material (e.g. cloth, fleece). Clean surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination.
<b>Environmental precautions</b>	Never return spills to original containers for re-use. For waste disposal, see section 13 of the SDS. Avoid discharge into drains, water courses or onto the ground. Do not discharge into lakes, streams, ponds or public waters.

## 7. Handling and storage

<b>Precautions for safe handling</b>	Obtain special instructions before use. Do not handle until all safety precautions have been read and understood. Read the entire label before using this product. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Do not breathe mist or vapour. Do not swallow. Pregnant or breastfeeding women must not handle this product. Wear appropriate personal protective equipment. Handle and open container with care. When using do not eat or drink. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse. Wash thoroughly after handling. DO NOT apply beyond the field boundary. DO NOT enter or allow worker entry into treated areas during the restricted-entry interval (REI) of 12 hours. Apply only when the potential for drift to areas of human habitation or areas of human activity such as houses, cottages, schools and recreational areas is minimal. Take into consideration wind speed, wind direction, temperature inversions, application equipment and sprayer settings. Do not use or store near heat or open flame. Herbicide can be stored in freezing conditions. If frozen, allow to thaw and agitate thoroughly prior to use. Store locked up.




